



Child Care Subsidy rates from 13 July 2020

This fact sheet outlines adjustments to Child Care Subsidy rates that take effect on 13 July 2020.

Income test

The percentage of Child Care Subsidy a family is entitled to is based on combined annual income. Child Care Subsidy income thresholds are adjusted annually in accordance with Consumer Price Index (CPI). The table below shows the income thresholds that apply from 13 July 2020.

2020 – 2021 CCS family income thresholds	Subsidy per cent (of actual fee charged or relevant hourly rate cap, whichever is lower)
Up to \$69,390	85%
More than \$69,390 to below \$174,390	Decreasing to 50% *
\$174,390 to below \$253,680	50%
\$253,680 to below \$343,680	Decreasing to 20% *
\$343,680 to below \$353,680	20%
Equal to or above \$353,680	0%

*Subsidy gradually decreases by 1 per cent for each \$3000 of family income.
